But, through it all, owner-operators Mikey and Celeste Lucas have stood their ground and built steadfast destinations for fair-price food, drink, music and socializing and embraced their loyal, quirky, funny, wild-edged community of friends and clientele.

Thanks to a long and loyal relationship with their landlord, her offer to sell for a fair market price, some hard work securing the financing — now they own the amazing businesses, the buildings and the ground underneath them. Big sacrifices were made, risks were taken and bank accounts were emptied, but now Slims & Pig Iron are one giant step towards being permanent fixtures.
